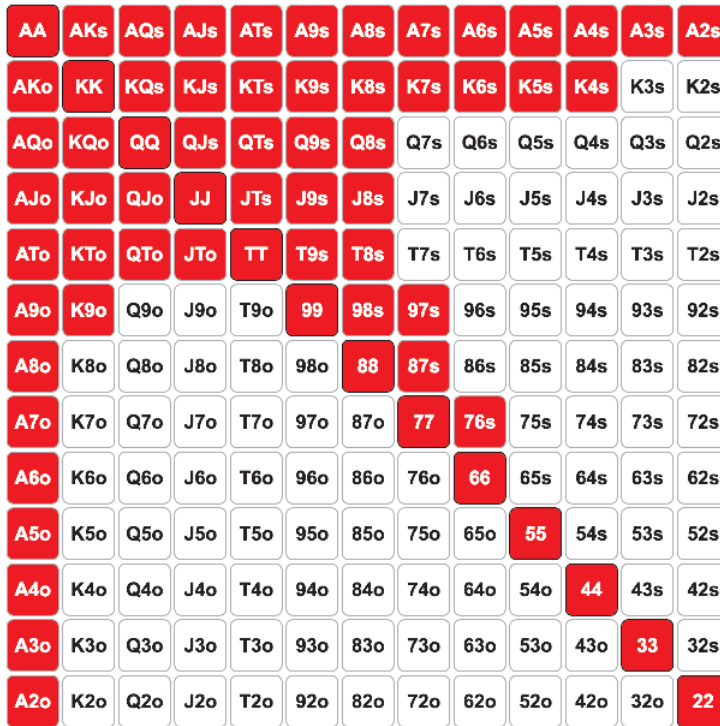


6 big blind stack from the lojack, this time with antes in play (*Diagram 13*).

Always be sure to pay attention to the blind and ante structure of the game you are playing. If the antes are 12.5% of the big blind and you forget to account for them, you will make a significant blunder. The difference between being able to profitably push 22% of hands and 33% of hands is huge.

As you move to the later positions, you should strongly consider adjusting your pushing range based on your opponents' calling strategies. For example, if you have J-10o with a 6 big blind stack in the lojack seat with no antes in play, you should normally fold. However, if the players at your table play much too tightly when facing all-in bets (as many amateurs do) you should probably go all-in.
